

NATIONAL QUIZ BEE

Elementary Makabayan (Philippine History, Culture & Values) Category

1. All contestants will answer the same set of Questions in writing. Before a question is read, the contestants must raise their Uni markers.
2. Questions will be read twice by the Quizmaster; once in English and once in Filipino.
3. After the second (2nd) reading, the Quizmaster shall say “go”—only then will the contestants be allowed to write their answer. Automatically, the ten (10) second time – limit will be given with the word “go” by the Quizmaster.

Elementary Mathematics Category

1. All contestants will answer the same set of questions in writing. Before a question is read, the contestants must raise their Uni markers.
2. Questions will be read twice in English by the Quizmaster. Contestants may start computing on the second (end) reading of the question.
3. After the second (2nd) reading, the Quizmaster shall say “go”. Automatically, the twenty (20) second time – limit will begin the word “go” by the Quizmaster

Secondary Science & Technology Category

1. All contestants will answer the same set of questions in writing. Before a question is read, the contestants must raise their Uni markers.
2. Questions will be read twice in English by the Quizmaster.
3. After the second (2nd) reading, the Quizmaster shall say “go”. Automatically, the ten (10) second time – limit will be given with the word “go” by the Quizmaster. (Should the question require computation, contestants may start writing down notes on the second (2nd) time the question is read. After the second (2nd) reading, the Quizmaster shall say “go” and the time – limit will be extended to twenty (20) seconds.)

Guidelines number 4 onwards are applied to Elementary Makabayan, Elementary Mathematics and High School Science and Technology

4. After the time limit and the buzzer sounds, the contestant must stop writing and raise their answer boards.
5. The Quizmaster shall read and verify the contestants' answer.
6. There are four (4) rounds in each competition namely: Easy, Average, Difficult and Clincher. The Clincher round takes place only if there is a tie.
7. In the Easy Round, two (2) questions will be asked; in the Average Round, three (3) questions; in the Difficult Round, five (5) questions, and in the Clincher Round, as many questions as needed.
8. Points are assigned for each question answered correctly:

Easy question	-	1 point
Difficult question	-	2 points
Average questions	-	3 points
Clincher questions	-	5 points
9. After the fifth (5) question in the Difficult round, the total number of points of each contestant is tabulated.
10. The contestant who gets the highest number of points is automatically declared the Champion; and the second (2nd) highest---Runner – up.
11. Should there be a tie among the contestants getting the highest score or the second (2nd) highest score, the contest continues to the Clincher Round to determine the Champion or the Runner – up as the case may be
12. The total number of points of the tied contestants will revert back to zero (0).
13. In the Clincher Round, as many questions will be asked. Each question is assigned five (5) points. The contestant who first (1st) gets fifteen (15) points is declared the Winner.
14. Should both contestants reach fifteen (15) points at the same time, and another tie occur, one (1) more question will be asked to break the tie and so on until a Winner is declared.
15. In case the Champion is unable to compete in the next contest level (district, Division, Regional or national), duly certified Runner – ip will take the place of the Champion.

16. The duly registered teacher – coach of the contestant is the only person authorized to make a protest.
17. All protest should be referred to the Board of Judges immediately, before the Quizmaster reads the next question.
18. Only the teacher – coach will act as the Official Chaperon/Guardian of the contestant to the Summit of the Super Quiz Bee and the National Grand Finals.
19. The Board of Judges shall be in complete control of the contest. The decision shall be final on all questions/protest..
20. Any Department of Education (DepEd) personnel related by affinity or consanguinity up to the third (3rd) degree to any contestant or teacher – coach is disqualified in the committees involved in the planning and formulation of questions in the Quiz Bee contest nor can they act as coach of any contestant.
21. Past Champion Students of the National ASEAN and World Quiz Bee are no longer qualified to join the future Quiz Bee competitions to give other chance to aspire for the top honors.
22. All Champion Students of the National, ASEAN World Quiz Bee are automatically barred to join any similar contest for a period of one (1) year from their Quiz Bee Championship.
23. The term Quiz Bee and its logo is a duly registered trademark protected by the Intellectual Property Office.
24. The Quiz Bee name and logo can only be used for the sole purpose of multi – level eliminations for the Quiz Bee contest (School Level Quiz Bee, district Level Quiz Bee, Division Level Quiz Bee, Regional Level Quiz Bee and National Quiz Bee).
25. Legal action shall be taken against any organization or person utilizing the “Quiz Bee” name and /or logo without the formal approval of the Quiz Bee Foundation.
26. Any violation of the Quiz Bee House Rules and aforementioned rules shall result in forfeiture of titles, prizes and privileges of any winning contestant or teacher – coach concerned.

Mechanics and Guidelines

POPULATION EDUCATION QUIZ (POPED QUIZ)

1. The contest is open to all Fourth Year high school students of public and private schools.
2. One contestant per secondary school only.
3. Contestants will be provided with pen and numbered-colored-coded writing sheets during the contest. The monitor will collect writing sheets after every round.
4. English & Filipino will be used as the official languages in the conduct of the quiz.
5. There will be a total of twenty (20) questions to be given, 6 of which are “Easy” questions, 7 are “Average”, and 7 are “Difficult”.
6. Points for every correct answer will be as follows:
 - One (1) point - easy questions
 - Two (2) points - average questions
 - Three (3) points - difficult questions
7. The Quizmaster will read each question twice. Countdown will start after the question has been read the second time.
8. Contestant will be given a maximum of thirty (30) second to answer the question. Other will only be given ten (10) seconds.
9. Should a contestant wish to change an answer that he/she has written down, this answer should be crossed out with one horizontal line and the new answer written clearly above the crossed out answer. A contestant is allowed to change his/her answer within the time allotted for a particular questions.
10. All ties will be broken by the tiebreaker questions from the “difficult” category.
11. The following procedure will be observed in case of a protest or inquiry during the actual proceedings.
 - Only the official coach of the contestant is allowed to raise a protest or inquiry at the earliest appropriate time during the contest;
 - The protest or inquiry will be addressed orally to the Chairman of the Board of Judges who will recognize the protest or inquiry;
 - The Chairman of the Board of Judges will announce the decisions resulting from the protest or inquiry at the earliest appropriate time during the contest.

General Rules for contest Proper in all subject Categories

1. All contestants will answer the same set of questions in writing. Before a question is read, the contestant must raise their Uni markers.
2. After the time limit and the buzzer sounds, the contestants must stop writing and raise their answer boards.
3. The Quizmaster/proctor shall read and verify the contestants' answer.
4. There are four rounds in each competition. Two (2) questions will be asked in the Easy round, three (3) questions in the Average round, five (5) questions in the difficult round and as many questions in the clincher round.

5. After the fifth (5th) question in the difficult round, the total number of points of each contestant is tabulated.
6. The contestants who gets the highest number of points is automatically declared the Champions; and the second (2nd) highest – Runner up.
7. Should there be a tie among the contestants getting the highest score or the second (2nd) highest score, the contest continues to the Clincher round to determine the Champion or the Runner –up as the case may be.
8. The total number of points of the total of the tied contestants will revert back to zero (0).
9. In the Clincher round, as many questions will be asked. Each correct answer is assigned five (5) points. The contestant who gives the correct answer is declared the Winner.
10. Should both contestants remain tied, more questions will be asked to break the tie and so on until Winner is declared.
11. In case the Champion is unable to compete in the next contest level (District, Division , Regional or National), duly certified Runner-up will take the place of the Champion.

General Rules in case of Protest

1. The duly registered coach of the contestant is the only person authorized to make protest.
2. All protest should be referred to the Board of Judges immediately before the Quizmaster reads the next question.
3. The Board of Judges must not entertain any and all protest after the next question is read.
4. No protest will be entertained by the Board of Judges without proof of reference.
5. A protest is allotted a 5 – minute time limit. Time starts from the time the protest has been made with the Board of Judges. The BOJ must make a final decision on or before the time limit. The final decision must be unanimous among the BOJ.
6. In case of a deadlock decision, the BOJ can nullify a question and replace it with another question. The decision can only be made on extreme cases.
7. The Board of Judges' decision shall be final in all protested questions.

Rotary Communication Contest

CONTEST MECHANICS

General Guidelines

1. Only bonafide pupils/students enrolled under the jurisdiction of DepEd Region 12 Sarangani-DepEd division are allowed to join.
2. Each school must conduct their own qualifying round on/or before July 28, 2014. Only one (1) school qualifier per category will be included in the district level competition which will be done on August 15, 2014 at a designated venue later. Only one (1) winner will be proclaimed for each category during the district search, who will represent their district for the division level on August 29, 2014 at a designated venue later. The proclaimed winners in the division level (top three winners per category) will likewise represent their division for the FINAL round which will be done on September 8, 2014 at The Rock Garden, San Isidro, Lagao, General Santos City.

3. Each contestant is not allowed to join more than 1 category due to its simultaneous conduct of the event.
4. Prizes include trophies, medals, cash, and certificates of participation/recognition.
5. The contestant must be present ten minutes before the event. Otherwise, s/he will automatically be disqualified.

Oratorical Contest

Mechanics:

1. The Oratorical piece must be original and must expound on the achievement of the Rotary International, embracing the theme “Light up Rotary” and the slogan “Enjoy Rotary.”
2. All orations must be in English.
3. All oration pieces must not exceed 1000 words. Delivery must not be less than 4 minutes nor more than 5 minutes. A bell will ring once when the contestant has already consumed 4 minutes of the allotted time, this means that he/she has 1 minute remaining to finish the piece. At the end of 5 minutes, the bell will ring twice.
5. The oration shall not, in whole or in part, express or impliedly, subvert the principles of Democracy nor offend any religion, sect or creed, nor violate neither the standards of decency nor the laws on libel and oral defamation.
6. The sequence of the orator’s presentation shall be determined through drawing of lots.
7. All winning entries automatically become official property of the Rotary Club of Dadiangas.

Extemporaneous Speaking Contest

Mechanics:

1. The topic shall be given on the spot by the judges.



2. The contestants shall be given 3 minutes to prepare and 3 minutes to deliver.
3. Speeches should be delivered in English.
4. The style of the delivery shall be conversational, oratorical or a combination of both.
5. The contestant should not wear his/her school uniform.
6. Use of sound effects, microphones and props is strictly prohibited.
7. The judges' decision is final and irrevocable.
8. The sequence of the speaker's presentation shall be determined through drawing of lots.
9. Criteria for Judging:

<i>Content, Clarity and Organization</i> -----	40%
<i>Delivery</i> -----	20%
<i>Pronunciation, Enunciation, Diction</i> -----	20%
<i>Stage presence (eye contact, poise, personality)</i> --	20%
TOTAL -----	100%

On-the-Spot Essay Writing Contest

Mechanics:

1. The Essay must be original and must expound on the achievement of the Rotary International, embracing the theme "Light up Rotary" and the slogan "Enjoy Rotary."
2. The contestants will provide their own materials (at least 5 clean short bond paper and 2 black ballpens).
3. All Essays should be written in English and shall consist of not less than 500 words nor more than 600 words.
4. The essay shall not, in whole or in part, express or impliedly, subvert the principles of Democracy nor offend any religion, sect or creed, nor violate neither the standards of decency nor the laws on libel and oral defamation.
5. All winning entries will automatically become official property of the Rotary Club of Dadiangas.
6. No distinguishing mark or name of the contestant shall appear in the entry.
7. Criteria for Judging:

Content and Relevance to the theme/slogan - - - -	40%
Structure and Cycle - - - - -	35%
Originality - - - - -	25%
TOTAL - - - - -	100%

On-the-Spot Poster Making Contest

Mechanics:

1. The painting/poster must be original and must expound on the achievement of the Rotary International, embracing the theme "Light up Rotary" and the slogan "Enjoy Rotary."
2. This shall be a mixed-medium competition.



3. All other materials must be brought by the individual contestant. Allowed materials to be used

are as follows: markers/pens/pencil, colored pencils, crayons, pastel, oil paints, poster color, water color, ink, ruler.

4. All artworks must be done only on the spot, and must be completed within the allotted time of three hours.

5. The contestants will use and provide their own one-fourth (1/4) illustration board.

6. No distinguishing mark or name of the contestant shall appear in the entry.

7. Judges' decision is final and irrevocable.

8. All winning entries will automatically become official property of the Rotary Club of Dadiangas.

9. Criteria for Judging:

Articulation/Relevance to the theme/slogan- - - - -	40%
Artistry/Creativity/Mastery on use of medium - - - - -	30%
Originality - - - - -	30%
TOTAL - - - - -	100%
